In trust to secure the payment of a bond of twenty dollars with interest from the first day of Decr. 1852, which John W. Gulley holds against the said Nathl. T. Linsay, also a bond of eight four dollars and fifty eight with interest from the seventh day of Decr. 1852, and also a bond of ten dollars and twenty five cents, with interest from the fifth day of March 1853, all made payable to said John W. Gulley, and also one open account supposed to be about thirty dollars which the said John W. Gulley also holds against the said Nathl. T. Linsay.
