Story, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and John C. Beale, of the same County and State of the other part, Whereas that in consideration of the sum of forty dollars and fifty cents to them in hand paid by the said John C. Beale, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Mary Story, Eliza Doyle (and Martha A. his wife, and Elija B. J. Story) do grant and sell unto the said John C. Beale this tract and assigns for ever, one certain parcel or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Andrew, containing by a plat survey thirteen of half acres to the same more or less, it being part of the land of which Jacobus Story dec'd possessed (and part of the tract of land formerly owned by Rebecca Beale, and purchased by Col.
