This Indenture made this 19th day of September eighteen hundred and fifty three, between James
 R. Person of the first part and the children of Robt. Dudley Dec. of the other part, all of
 the county of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witnesseth: that the said James
 R. Person for and in consideration of the money paid his father by one August-
 us W. Hart and who sold the land to Robt. Dudley, hath this day
 granted, bargained, confirmed & by these presents does grant, bargain and
 confirm unto the said children all his title, interest in & to the aforementioned
 land, the boundaries more fully appearing by deed from John A. Person to A.W.
 Hart of Feb. 5th day of Dec. 1845. And the said James R. Person was
 aware generally the land hereby conveyed to said children. Witnesseth the
 following signature and seal.

Memorandum of a contract made and entered into this 15th day of April 1853, between
 Alexander Myrick and Charlotte Everett, both of lawful age. Witnesseth that whereas
 a marriage is intended by Divine permission shortly to be had and solemnized by and
 between the said Alexander Myrick and Charlotte Everett each of whom is at present
 possessed of property. And whereas the distinct understanding and agreement between the parties
 is that each shall to all future time exercise the entire right, control and disposition of their
 present respective property after the said intended marriage precisely to the same extent and in
 the same manner, as if said marriage had never occurred.

Now execution of this agreement and in consideration of the mutual relinquishment herein
 contained, the parties aforesaid do hereby covenant and contract each with the
 other: in the first place, that the said Alexander Myrick shall not appropriate
 or otherwise dispose of any part of the property which now belongs to the said Char-
 lotte Everett or which she may hereafter acquire, but the same is to be retained
 in her solely during her life, and with liberty reserved to dispose of the same by deed
 or will to whomsoever she pleases; and in the second place, that she the said C. Everett
 shall have no claim, right or title whatsoever to any part or description of the
 property real, personal, or mixed which the said Alexander Myrick now owns or
 may hereafter acquire, either during the said contemplated marriage or afterwards
 should she survive it, and is not to assert a claim or have any right
 whatever either legal or equitable to any dower or distribution, proportion
 of his estate or any compensation for the same to any extent whatsoever.

 date first above written.
