Cobb his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one parts and William P. Moore of the said County and State of the other parts, Witnesseth: That the said William J. Cobb and Ann E. Cobb his wife in consideration of the sum of seven hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said William P. Moore at the sealing and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William P. Moore his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being the tract formerly belonging to John Cobb: Beginning at a corner in John Gardner's line at the Cedar Swamp, supposing to run S. E. course along the said Swamp to a corner in Jesse Parker's line, thence being the said J. Parker's line supposing to be a W. course to a corner in the said J. Parker's line, for John W. Gardner thence along the said John W. Gardner's line supposing to be a west course to a corner where began in the said Swamp, containing two hundred and eighty one acres (more or less) together with all and singular the appertinances whatsoever therunto belonging or in any way appertaining: To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with warranty of title rights members and appertinances unto the said William P. Moore his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William J. Cobb and Ann E. Cobb and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the premises and appertinances hereinbefore mentioned unto the said William P. Moore his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said William J. Cobb and Ann E. Cobb his wife, their heirs and all and every person or persons whatsoever shall, will and do warrant and defend of these presents. In witness whereof the said William J. Cobb and Ann E.
