This Deed made this 17th day of October A.D. 1853, between James H. Dwainy and Nancy J. his wife of the one part and George Lawrence of the other part; Witheth: That in consideration of the sum of several hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said George Lawrence, the said James H. Dwainy and Nancy J. his wife do grant bargain and sell to the said George Lawrence a certain tract or parcel of land and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, containing one hundred and fifty six acres more or less which I purchased from George A. W. Newsome the boundaries of which can be seen of reference to deed from Robert J. Edwards of wife to Geo. A. W. Newsome of record, dated Sept. 15. 1849, also one other tract which I also purchased from the said Newsome called the Tutel tract containing twenty acres more or less the boundaries of which be seen by reference to deed from Shadrach Tutel to said Newsome and of record October 18. 1847. And the said James H. Dwainy and his wife Nancy J. covenant with the said George Lawrence that they will warrant and defend the right of title herby conveyed against themselves and all and every person or persons whatsoever claiming under or by us.
