Cobb of the said County of Southampton of the other part, Witnesseth: that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and ninety dollars the said Jane W. Prillow, Elizabeth Ann Crenshaw and Mary Jane Crenshaw do grant unto the said Leonard C. Cobb all their right and interest in and to a certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the said County of Southampton, containing ninety five acres more or less. (It being the same tract of land conveyed to Jordan Denon by Edward Griffin & wife by deed dated the 23rd day of June 1803. of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Court and inherited by them, the said Jane W. Prillow, and Elizabeth Crenshaw and Mary Jane Crenshaw from the said Jordan Denon and for a more particular description of said tract or parcel of land reference is made to said deed of record as aforesaid. And the said Jane W. Prillow, Elizabeth Ann Crenshaw & Mary Jane Crenshaw covenant with the said Leonard C. Cobb that they will warrant generally the title of the said tract of land. This Indenture made the 20th day of February 1854, between Harrison S. Soper of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part and James Davy of the County of State of the other part: Witnesseth: that for and in consideration of the sum of ninety dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged of the said Soper, I have granted and sold unto the said James Davy his heirs and assigns a certain piece of land lying in said County and bounded by the lands of said Davy on the north east and south, and a swamp in the west which swamp is the dividing line of said land and the lands belonging to Wm. Williams, containing forty one acres to be the same more or less, which said land, and all contents thereto belonging. The said Soper do warrant and forever defend the right and title to the said James Davy and his heirs. In
