

I, Mary Branch of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia have this day bargained and sold and do hereby transfer and convey to Mary E. Summrell and her heirs for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and ninety one dollars to me paid abstract of land in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia on which John Williamson lived and died containing one hundred and ninety one acres more or less and bounded as follows: on the north by James B. Miquardt's lands on the east by Miquardt & J. B. Qualtrey's, on the south by J. B. Qualtrey's on the west by the Stillman tract and J. B. Miquardt. To have and to hold the same to the said Mary E. Summrell her heirs and assigns forever. I do covenant to the said Mary E. Summrell that I am lawfully seised of said land, have a good right to convey it, and that the said land is unincumbered. I do further covenant and bind myself, my heirs and representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to said land and every part thereof to the said Mary E. Summrell her heirs and assigns against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. Witness my hands and seal this 15th day of July 1850.
