North 23 poles to a white oak, thence N. 33° W. 32 1/4 poles to a white oak, a corner
S. 61 1/2° E. 20 poles to a west gum, thence S. 67 1/2° E. 30 poles to a post near a
Sweet gum & now came for the parties, thence South 31 1/2 poles to the first
Stake. To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land
and premises, with the appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise ap-
pertaining unto him the said Watson Howell his heirs and assigns
forever. To and for the only use, service and behoof of him the said Watson
Howell his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Amos Copeland and
Louisa his wife for themselves their heirs, executors, and administrators, do
humbly covenant and agree to and with the said Watson Howell his heirs,
executors, administrators and assigns that they will by these presents warrant
and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of
land and premises against the claims or demands of all and every person or

This Deed made the third day of March in the year 1854, between John Taylor and
Honey E. his wife of the first part and Samuel C. Hart of the second part.
Whereas: that in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty five Dollars
and cents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged the said John Taylor and
Honey E. his wife do grant unto the said Samuel C. Hart all that tract of
land in which John Williamson lived and died and known as the old place
tract and bounded as follows: On the north by the lands of James B. Higginbotham
esq; on the south and southwest by Samuel C. Hart's land, and on all other
sides by the lands of James B. Higginbotham esq; and contains one hundred
and ninety six acres more or less. To have and to hold the same to the said
Samuel C. Hart his heirs and assigns forever. They to covenant to the
