This Deed made and executed the eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, between Jesse Parker, Sen. and Richard Parker of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the one part, and W<sup>m</sup> S. Moore of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said Jesse Parker Sen. & Richard Parker for and in consideration of the sum of eighty dollars to them in hand paid by the said W<sup>m</sup> S. Moore at and before the signing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) they the said Jesse Parker Sen. and Richard Parker have bargained and sold (and by these presents do bargain and sell) unto the said W<sup>m</sup> S. Moore his heirs and assigns a certain piece or parcel of land Situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County and bounded as follows: Beginning at a black gum a corner of the said Jesse Parker & Richard Parker in said Moore's line, thence S. 22° W. 34 poles to a pine at the head landing from South Dock to Jerusalem, thence along the road S. 15° E. 30 poles, thence S. 60° E. 14 poles, thence S. 77° W. 24 poles to the run of the Indian branch, then up the run of said branch in part and by a line of markers two 54 poles, to the beginning containing right acres more or less, together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said W<sup>m</sup> S. Moore his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Jesse Parker Sen. & Richard Parker for themselves and their heirs the said piece or parcel of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said W<sup>m</sup> S.
