This indenture, made the first day of July eighteen hundred and fifty four, between
Jno. J. Johnson of the one part and James M. Corbitt of the other part: Witnesseth,
that the said John J. Johnson doth grant unto the said James M. Corbitt
the following personal property (To-wit:) Three feather beds, one chest of
drawers, one bed of posts, household and kitchen furniture, crop of Corn, fodder
of peas, one pair of hls, 5 sides hls, pots, Spiders, axes, 3 fowls & all of the
farming utensils. In trust to secure a bond of Twenty five dollars
due 1st July 1854, to Simon W. Dack, also a second bond of twenty six dollars
and 2/100 due 27th day of May 1854, to Robert D. Marshall. And the
said Jno. J. Johnson do covenant with and warrant generally the title to the
aforesaid estate hereby conveyed to the aforesaid James M. Corbitt, for
the purposes herein specified. Witness the following signatures and seals:

This deed made the 23rd day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred
and fifty four, between Edward D. Phillips of the County of Nansemond of the
first part and James A. Gillette and Jos. C. Gillette of the County of South-
ampton of the other part: Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of eight
hundred dollars in hand paid or otherwise secured, the said Edward
D. Phillips doth grant unto the said James A. Gillette and Joseph
C. Gillette their heirs and assigns, all that tract or parcel of wood-
land lying and being in County of Southampton and State of Virginia,
containing two hundred and six acres more or less and is bounded by
the lands of Caroline P. Ricks, the road leading from Jerusalem to
Dorchester and the Swamp leading to the Appamocock and the Appamocock
down to the said Caroline P. Ricks' line, it being the woodland the
said Edward D. Phillips in right of his wife Virginia D. Phillips who was
Virginia D. Ricks derived title too upon a division of Edwin Ricks' land
and the said Edward D. Phillips does hereby sell and release to the said
James A. Gillette and Joseph C. Gillette & their heirs forever the said
tract of woodland, and hereby warrant and defend the title thereof
