This indenture, made this 8th day of August 1854, between James R. Brock of
the first part Samuel Helle of the second and Jas. M. Guiley of the third part.
Whereas the said James R. Brock is justly indebted to the said Jas. M.
Guiley in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars of cents by this bearing
and special date with these presents; which debt with the interest which
may accrue the said James R. Brock is willing and desirous to secure
in this indenture witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of one
dollar in hand paid by the said Samuel Helle at and before the sealing
and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
to the said James R. Brock hath given, granted, bargained and sold unto
the said Samuel Helle the following personal property, to wit: his said
Brock's opening crop of corn, fodder and pease, crop of grain, pease or small
corn, one work steer, 5 head of cattle, 13 hogs, 2 shot guns, household
furniture, one cart & wheels, farming utensils &c. To have and
to hold the said hereby granted property to him the said Samuel Helle,
his heirs, executors & successors forever. And the said James R. Brock to hold
his heirs, executors & successors & toth hereby warrant, the right & title of the aforesaid
property to the said Samuel Helle agt. the claim of each and every person
whatsoever. Upon trust nevertheless, that the said Samuel Helle, his
heirs executors & administrators shall permit the said James R. Brock to remain
in quiet & peaceable possession of the said property, until default be made
in the payment of said debt either in part or the whole, then upon this
further trust, that he the said Saml Helle his heirs, executors &c
shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment
as he may think proper or the said Jas M. Guiley shall demand
sell to the highest bidder at public auction during the month
of the time and place of sale, the property hereby conveyed, from the
proceeds of such sale first pay all cost attending these presents,
secondly pay the debt & interest hereby secured, the surplus of any
pay to the said James R. Brock or any person whom he may
