This indenture, made this 8th day of August 1854, between James R. Brook of the first part Samuel Kello of the second and John M. Gurley of the third part. Whereas the said James R. Brook is justly indebted to the said John M. Gurley in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars of cents by hand bearing equal date with these presents; which debt with the interest which may accrue the said James R. Brook is willing and desirous to secure. Now this indenture witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said Samuel Kello at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James R. Brook hath given, granted, conveyed and sold unto the said Samuel Kello the following personal property, to-wit: his certain Brook growing crop of corn fodder and pease, crop of ground pease on bond coat, one work steer, 5 head of cattle, 13 hogs, 2 shot guns, household & kitchen furniture, one cart & wheels, farming utensils &c. To have and to hold the said hereby granted property to him the said Samuel Kello, his heirs, executors &c. forever. And the said James R. Brook for himself his heirs, executors &c. doth hereby warrant, the right & title of the above property to the said Samuel Kello against the claims of each and every person whatsoever. Upon trust nevertheless, that the said Samuel Kello, his heirs executors & administrators shall permit the said James R. Brook to remain in quiet & peaceable possession of the said property, until default be made in the payment of said debt either in part or the whole, then upon the further trust, that he the said Samuel Kello his heirs, executors &c. shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment as he may think proper or the said John M. Gurley shall request sell to the highest bidder at public auction giving due notice of the time and place of sale, the property hereby conveyed, from the proceeds of such sale first pay all cost attending these premises, secondly pay the debt of interest hereby secured, the surplus if any pay to the said James R. Brook or any person whom he may otherwise to receive the same. In testimony whereof we the parties hereto have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the day & date first above written.
