

This Indenture, made and entered, this 9th day of August A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, between Jordan Johnson of the first part, and Giles Brooks trustee of the second part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witnesseth, that the said Jordan Johnson, hath, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar and no parts, acknowledged, bargained and sold, (and is, by these presents bargain and sell, release and confirm unto the said Giles Brooks trustee his heirs and assigns forever, one mare and her fetters increase, one steer, one cow, two pigs, ten pigs, and their increase, one cart and wheels, one saddle, one bridle, two chairs, one gun, all the said Jordan Johnson's growing crop of every kind, upon the following condition and trust, viz: the said Jor. Johnson is justly indebted to his mother Elizabeth Johnson in the sum of one hundred and thirty four dollars and no cents which appears by note bearing date with these presents, and unto Jas. W. Murfee in the just and full sum of _____ dollars (and _____ cents it being the amount of the said Jordan Johnson's store account with the said Jas. W. Murfee. And if the said Jordan Johnson shall fail to pay and satisfy the above debt or either of them when or when required by them or within of the creditors, it shall then be legal and right for the said Giles Brooks, trustee, after giving sufficient notice of the time and place of sale to sell at publick auction all the within named property, or enough thereof to satisfy the aforesaid debt and costs, and pay the same, and the overplus if any pay over to the said Jordan Johnson his heirs and assigns. Bryant & Margaret his wife of the County of Southampton, in the State of Virginia, of the one part, (and Godwin Parker of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said W^m D. Bryant & Margaret his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said Godwin Parker at and before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said W^m D. Bryant & Margaret his wife have given, granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Godwin Parker his heirs and assigns forever, four thousand two hundred square feet of land, it being the Cemetery, or family burying ground at the plantation called and known as the "Carr Place" lying and being in the aforesaid County, and marked and bounded as follows: Beginning at a post at the corner of the garden, thence N 63° W. 60 feet; thence S 27° W. 70 feet to a post, thence S. 63° E. 60 feet to another post at the garden, thence N 27° E 70 feet to the beginning: with the right of way, or ingress and egress to the
