Naflet, my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns shall ever keep any public or private ordinary house, or cause to be kept one on a certain Lot of Land which I, the said A. W. Naflet purchased of Richard Barrett, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, lying on the north side of the County road leading from Stratton depot to Jerusalem and in the village of Franklin depot in the aforesaid County bounded and for deed with the bearing date the 25th day of April 1851, I the said A. W. Naflet do by these presents bind myself, my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns to pay to the aforesaid Richard Barrett his heirs, executors or assigns the just sum of one thousand dollars, I, the said A. W. Naflet also coveys all my right, title and interest in the aforesaid Lot of Land to the aforesaid R. Barrett his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns as security for the above amount of one thousand dollars in case the above restriction is forfeited. If I, the said A. W. Naflet my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns never does keep or cause to be kept any public or private ordinary house on the above lot, then the above obligation is null and void, otherwise remain in full
