

The jury summoned to lay out the bounds in dispute between Jesse Parker and Littleton Moon find their boundaries as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a Cypress standing at the mouth of a branch emptying in the Cedar Swamp, thence up the said branch to a Post Oak standing in an old Dam for a corner, thence corner for Jesse Parker 2 1/2 yards from a Persimmon tree on the line run, thence North 69 degrees west 62 1/2 poles to sweet gum following a line of marked trees, thence North 53 degrees West 8 1/2 poles to a water oak near bend of the road, thence southerly corner to the road &c. the jury further find that by our verdict the said Littleton Moon has recovered of the said Jesse Parker 30 acres which the said Parker had in possession (and believing that we have no power under the law to dispose of the costs of this proceeding do refer the same to Court.

A Court held for the County of Southampton, the 11th day of August, 1854.
The jury impeached pursuant to an order of the Court made at the June term last of this Court, to lay out the bounds in dispute between Littleton Moon and Jesse Parker. This day returned their report relative to the bounds of the land between the said Littleton Moon and Jesse Parker &c. it is ordered that the said report be recorded, that the lines there mentioned be reestablished between the parties and that the said Jesse Parker pay to the said Littleton Moon his costs.

This deed made the 11th day of August A.D. 1854, between William Musfer of the one part and Henry R. Cammell, of the other part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. Witnesseth: that in consideration of four thousand and two hundred dollars in hand, the said W^m Musfer doth grant unto the said H. R. Cammell all of the tract or parcel of land known as Littleton including the old Fowler tract (which Jno. S. Brooks purchased several years past) and adjoining the lands of Hardy Croft, the heirs of Wills Musfer and James W. Gardner and others, and the said W^m Musfer warrants the property hereby conveyed against the claim or demands of himself, his heirs, and persons claiming under, through or by him only. Witness the following signature and seal.
