

This was made the 18th day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, between St. Bishop (grantor) of the first part, and Jos. J. Kinross (grantee) of the second part, Witnesseth: that the said St. Bishop grants and conveys unto the said Jos. J. Kinross all his right title and interest in and to a certain tract or parcels of land lately sold by Jos. E. Gillette to the said grantor lying in the County of Southampton, bounded the one tract by Parker, D. Strong, Miles D. Strong, and others containing one hundred and sixty six and $\frac{1}{2}$ acres more or less, in other tract lying in the County of So.ampton and bounded by the lands of Thos. Strong, Regina C. Barlett, Richard Darden Jr., Henry Blaw, and others containing one hundred & thirty six and $\frac{1}{2}$ acres more or less, and the other tract lying in the County of Southampton and bounded by the lands of Archib. Vick, Sharper Vick, Henry Blaw, and others, containing three hundred and thirty eight and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres more or less. In trust to secure the payment of a certain debt due to Jos. E. Gillette which debt was originally created by bond executed to Jonathan Darden guardian for the said Gillette wife and transferred by said guardian to said Gillette - said bond being signed by Jos. L. Bishop, W. S. Smith & St. Bishop, upon which judgment was obtained at the May term of the Circuit Court 1851, the principal of which bond was \$57. 17/100 with interest from said 1st 1850 and costs. This Indenture, made and entered into on this 26th day of August in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty four, between Patience Vick, Mary Gillett, Albert W. Ferguson, and Sarah C. Ferguson, his wife, Henry D. Ferguson, and Ann E. Ferguson, his wife, and Caroline Vick all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part, and Eliza Dope of the same County and State of the other part: Witnesseth: that the said Patience Vick, Mary Gillett, Albert W. Ferguson and Sarah C. his wife, Henry D. Ferguson and Ann E. his wife and Caroline V. Vick for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said Eliza Dope at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Now granted, bargained and sold (and by these presents do grant, bargain, and sell unto him the said Eliza Dope his heirs and assigns forever all their right, title and interest in the tract or parcel of land whereon the said Eliza Dope now resides, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St. Lukes, it being the tract or parcel of land sold under a Deed of trust by Isaac Ellsworth trustee and purchased by Matthew Vick as will appear by reference to the deed from said Ellsworth to said Matthew Vick bearing date the 18th day of February 1843, containing by estimation one hundred and ninety three and one third acres (or the same more or less) and bounded by the land of Harrison S. Dope, John D. Myrick & others. To have (and to hold) all the aforesaid right, title and interest of them the said Patience Vick, Mary A. Scott, Albert W. Ferguson and Sarah C. his wife, Henry D.
