This deed, made this 13th day of May in the year 1854 between Samuel T. Hollings and Littlebury C. Sledge: Witnesseth that the said Hollings in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars, hath granted and sold to the said Sledge all of his interest in the land now in the possession of his Mother Eliza Rawlings as the widow of Gregory Rawlings dec'd, containing about four hundred acres and situate in the County of Southampton, and bounded by the lands of Samuel Barham, M. C. Cole, and others. And the said Rawlings conveys the above granted land with general Warranty.

Barrett Trust.

This Deed, made this twenty fifth day of February in the year. One thousand eight hundred and fifty four, between Mills Barrett of the County of Isle of Wight of the one part, and Thomas Hall (trustee as is hereinafter mentioned) of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Mills Barrett in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars, hath grant, unto the said Thomas Hall for the purposes hereinafter mentioned) (and his executors (and administrators, the following) estate and property, to wit: All and every right, title, interest (and estate of him the said Mills Barrett in and to negro slaves, Ben, Lucy, Esther, George, China, Mary (and Jonas (and any increase of the same since the 8th day of August 1845, together with the late right, title (and interest in all other estate, which (together with the said negro slaves) were conveyed to W^m D. Wood, as trustee on the 8th day of August 1845, by Articles of Marriage Agreement between the said Mills Barrett and Nancy Coxton (and which of record in the Clerk's office of Southampton) Isle of Wight County - which said Nancy is now the wife of said Mills Barrett. also all the right, title, interest (and estate of the said Mills Barrett, in (and to a tract of land in the County of Isle of Wight, which contains three hundred (and six of a quarter acres more or less, adjoining the lands of Stephen S. Darden, John Nelson, Dixon W. Motcham, Josiah Ely (and others, and which was conveyed by deed dated 20th of December 1837, and duly recorded, by Josiah Ely (and wife to said Mills Barrett (and Nancy his wife, on certain trusts (and covenants as mentioned in said Deed. Also all right, title (and interest of the said Mills Barrett in and to any of the said estate, whether land, negroes, or other estate, which have been the income or profits or produce of the property hereinbefore named or referred to, as also all benefit, interest and profits which may hereafter accrue from the same. In Trust nevertheless, for the uses and purposes following, to wit: that is to say: The said Thomas Hall, is to hold the estate (and property hereby conveyed, for
