This Deed made this 8<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year eighteen hundred and fifty four, between  
William H. Wood and Mary L. C. his wife of the one part and James Johnson, Alanson  
T. S. Merritt, William H. C. Merritt and David S. Walton of the other part, witnesseth  
that in consideration of Twelve Thousand of forty four dollars and eighty five cents paid  
or secured to be paid to the said Wood by the said parties of the second part  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said Wood and wife do  
grant unto the said parties of the second part all of the right, title and interest  
of them in the said Wood and wife either of them in and to all of the property  
real and personal now owned and belonging to the partnership known as the  
Nottingham Lumber Company, and composed of the following Gentlemen, to wit:  
the said Wood, George W. Smith, Mark T. Peets and John M. Bailey.  
The interest of the said Wood being one undivided half of the property of  
the said Lumber Company, and the said Wood doth also upon the considera-  
tion aforesaid convey and assign unto the said parties of the second part,  
all of his right, title and interest in any and all contracts entered into by or on  
account of the said Lumber Company, and doth also upon the consideration aforesaid  
convey unto the said parties of the second part all his right, title and interest and  
property in the Logging business connected with said Company and all the tools,  
tools, apparatus and appliances for logging and sawing on hand being used  
in the said business and all contracts for logging and sawing for said  
Company, of also the claim of the said Wood to compensation for his services rendered  
to the said Company, and the said parties of the second part do hereby  
bind themselves severally and jointly in consideration of the premises aforesaid  
to discharge and perform any and all contracts or agreements on behalf of the  
said Company and on account of the said Logging business so as to release  
and save harmless from any liability the said Wood on account of any  
engagements with said Company and to do and perform any and all engagements  
entered into by the said Wood in behalf of the said Company or in account  
of the said Logging or Sawing business.

It being the true intent and meaning of this deed for the consideration  
aforesaid to transfer to the said parties of the second part all the right, title  
and interest of the said Wood in the Company aforesaid, and all the tools  
and property thereof, as well as in the said Logging and Sawing business free  
from any liability on the part of the said Wood on account of the said  
Company or any of the contracts, obligations or business thereto connected  
with the Logging or Sawing business of said parties heretofore or hereafter entered  
into by any and in any manner whatsoever.
