Mason, now being Consul Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to France, having full confidence in the fidelity, ability and integrity in my sons Lewis B. Mason and John Y. Mason Jr. both in Virginia, in the United States of America, have constituted and appointed, and by these presents do constitute and appoint my said sons, my joint and several attorneys in fact with full power for them jointly or severally in my name to receive any monies due to me, and to sell any of my property real or personal, whether in Virginia or in Mississippi two of its said United States, for cash or on credit as he or they may deem best and to receive the purchase money, and apply the proceeds to the payment of debts due by me and to make due and legal conveyances of the property so sold & do any and all things in the management and sale of my property real and personal, for me and in my name, to the same extent that I could do so, if I were personally present. And I do hereby bind myself, to ratify their joint or several acts, and confirm the same in the premises, as fully as if I had done the same in my own proper person.
