State and John Eversack of Sussex County of the third, Witnesseth: That  
for and in payment of thirty seven Dollars and thirteen cents due the said John  
Eversack as administrator of W<sup>m</sup> D. Morris dec'd for which amount the said  
John Eversack has become security to the said Hester Morris; the said  
Hester Morris in order to secure the said John Eversack his heirs and assigns  
against said debt and interest mentioned above, hath bargained, granted and sold unto  
those presents doth bargain, grant and sell to the said Calvin H. Seaborough, Trustee  
for the same, the following property, to wit: 2 beds and furniture, 1 Chest of Drawers,  
1 Bedstead, 1 Walnut Table, and 1 Sett chairs. To have and hold the aforementioned  
property till the payment of the above sum of Thirty seven Dollars and thirteen  
cents with interest nine months from day of sale, the estate of W<sup>m</sup> D. Morris  
till paid. Now if the said Hester Morris shall on or before the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of  
August 1856, pay the sum of thirty seven Dollars and thirteen cents with interest  
then this Indenture to be null and void, but in the want of the said Hester Morris,  
his heirs and assigns failing to pay the aforesaid sum and interest, then the said  
Calvin H. Seaborough his heirs and assigns is authorized to sell the said property  
mentioned in this deed for cash after giving twenty days notice of the time  
at some publick place or two and the balance, if any, after paying said  
debt and interest and cost attending the sale of the same, shall be paid over to
