

This Deed made this 2nd day of January one thousand eight hundred & fifty five between Lucy Allman and Daniel Vick of the County of Southampton State of Virginia; that in consideration of the sum of ten hundred dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Lucy Allman doth grant, bargain sell unto the said Daniel Vick his heirs & assigns all that tract, tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton, which the said Lucy Allman purchased of Edwards & Bates and bounded as follows; on the North by Cary's bridge road leading from Vicksville, on the South by Morris Jernsey's land, on the West by A. Briggs & T. Briggs land, & on the East by the said Daniel Vick's land, containing by estimation 1.35 acres, be it the same more or less.

This Deed, made this 6th day of January in the year 1855, between Alfred L. Morris and Anarella his wife William T. Morris and Rebecca his wife of the one part and John Nines of the other part, Witnesses; that the said Alfred L. Morris, Anarella his wife and William T. Morris and Rebecca his wife, do grant unto the said John Nines the following property to-wit: A certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton, containing by estimation two hundred and ninety six acres more or less and bounded by the lands of John Odwell, Joshua Whotton, John Ketchum & others. in trust to secure S. D. Kells for thirty six dollars and fifty cents, due by bond bearing interest from the 22nd day of November 1854. also to indemnify him as security in ten different bonds due by the said Alfred L. & William T. Morris to the Commissioners appointed by the Court to sell said land, five of said bonds being due the 22nd day of November 1855, and the remaining five due the 22nd day of November 1856, and they do specially warrant the right hereby conveyed, the nature of the above obligation is such that if the aforesaid Alfred L. & William T. Morris should pay the above named bonds as they become due, then this deed to null & void, otherwise the said John Nines after giving reasonable notice shall proceed to sell the said land at public auction for cash, the proceeds to be applied to the payment of the said debts and expenses of the sale, the remainder if any to be paid over to the said Alfred L. & William T. Morris.
