This Dec^y, made the 11th day of January in the year 1855, between John Crumpler of the one part, and John Dutton of the other part, witnesseth: that the said John Crumpler hath grant unto the said John Dutton, the following property: a certain tract of land lying on the south side of Dutton's road, bounded by the lands of George B. Holloman &c., and of General Swamp, containing thirty acres more or less, also one bay horse, one ox, one cow and two sheeps, two hogs, five shoats and four pigs, one cart and wheels, two shot guns, one double and one single barrel, also whatever damages that may be assessed or accrue for the said John Crumpler's breach on account of the passage of the railroad of Dutton's Road through his land. In trust to secure Alexander Linton for one hundred and sixty Dollars due him by note and account, also Robert Dutton for seventy one Dollars & ten cents due him by note bearing interest from the 11th day of January 1855, also Peter F. Holmes for thirty six dollars and 75/100 due him by note bearing interest from January 1st 1855, and note being credited for 9.75 Nov^r 1st 1855, also Jeremiah Deak for fifty dollars due him by account for the hire of his bay Will do on the 25th day of December 1855, and also all of my past debt by note or account due this day, and the said John Crumpler hath specially warrant the title to the property hereby conveyed. The nature of the above obligation is such that if the said John Crumpler doth not redeem the notes and accounts as above included, then the said John Dutton shall, upon the application of either of the creditors after giving a notice of not less than ten days proceed to sell the above mentioned property at public auction for cash. The proceeds thereof are to be applied to the extinguishment of the above debts and the remainder if any to be paid over to the said John Crumpler.
