Williams and his heirs and assigns forever all right title and interest of every kind which she the said grantor has in or to a certain tract of land of which her father Matthew Williams died possessed, also all right title and interest of said grantor in the seven lands now held by Jane Peale now the widow of John S. Peale deceased, and late the widow of Matthew Williams deceased, which lands are situated in the County of Southampton aforesaid and adjoining the lands of Robert Hicks, John Davis, Jethro Charles and others and the said grantor hereby covenants to and with the said grantee that she has the right to sell and convey the estate aforesaid and that she will hereby warrant generally the same.

This Deed made the 5th day of February in the year 1855 between Benjamin Scott and L. C. Spear, of the one part and James E. Jenkins and James B. Norfolk (trustees) of the other part, witnesseth that the said Benjamin Scott and L. C. Spear do grant unto the said James E. Jenkins and James B. Norfolk trustees the following property, to wit: Four mules one bay horse, one pair of extra mules, four gray horses, one two horse wagon, seven blue carts, one set of harness, eight sets of team harness, six cars and the track work which they run, fifty six wheel barrows, one lot of wheeling plank, one lot of one inch planch, one very fine plough, one lot of blacksmith tools and the iron in the shop, one lot of hammers, pick axes, and other instruments used by the said Scott & Spear in constructing the works aforesaid, and track for a railroad - and all the estate of every kind whatsoever whether real or personal which they the said Benjamin Scott and L. C. Spear may have, and all their interests or demands of every kind whatever which they be entitled to them at law or in equity. In trust to secure the
