This Indenture made the 6th day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, between William Lankford and Martha Jane his wife of the one part and Wiley Lankford of the other part, witnesses that the said William Lankford and Martha Jane his wife in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Wiley Lankford at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold (and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Wiley Lankford his heirs and assigns, all our right title and interest in my Father's Jacobariah Lankford's plantation or tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton (and adjoining the lands of James Spence Richard Deal, Patrick Bane and William Webster together with all and singular houses and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or appertaining) with the same use, sizzed or accepted, reputed, taken or known as part parcel and member thereof and revision and reversion, profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold all our right title and interest in the premises Land or plantation with the premises herebefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights title and interest members and appurtenances unto the said Wiley Lankford his heirs and assigns forever and the said William Lankford and Martha Jane his wife for themselves and their heirs the said right title and interest in the said Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Wiley Lankford his heirs and assigns free from the claim of them said William Lankford and Martha Jane his wife or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
