

This deed made this 19th day of March 1855, between Nathan Turner of the first part and Eliska Ely, wife of the second part and Elias W. Whitney of the third part. Whereas the said Nathan Turner is indebted to said Eliska Ely in about five hundred one Dollars and twelve cents (\$512.12 cts) to which Eliska Ely is security and whereas the said Nathan Turner is anxious and willing to release the said Eliska Ely from all loss and harm by reason of the said security. And therefore the said Nathan Turner is anxious and willing to grant, bargain and sell unto the Eliska Ely for the consideration of one Dollar to him in hand paid the following property, to wit: four cows and furniture, one cow and calf, earlorn, seven sheep and kitchen furniture. To have and to hold upon trust, nevertheless, that the said Eliska Ely is to permit the said Nathan Turner to remain in quiet possession of the said property until default made in the payment of the above named bond due to Elias W. Whitney, then upon request made within by the said Eliska Ely or Elias Whitney the said trustee is to sell the said property after ten days notice at public auction for cash and after defraying the expenses of this trust deed pay the debt due the said Elias W. Whitney to which Eliska Ely is security and the balance if any pay over to Nathan Turner. In witness of all which, the parties have hereunto set their hands and seals the day above said.

That in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said William Rogers and Eliza his wife doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William Grunty two small tracts of land lying and being in the County of Southampton, one tract containing by estimation forty eight acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Galley Mansfield, John Green, Jesse Blatch, Thomas Drake & Matthew Williams, also a small tract called the middle tract containing by estimation fourteen acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Matthew Williams, John Dutton, Harrison Rogers & William Rogers (of Lane).
