This Indenture made and entered into this seventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, between Godwin Holland of the first part, James Wills of the second part and C. E. Mungie of the third part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Whitepath; that whereas the said Godwin Holland stands justly indebted to the said James Wills in the sum of one hundred and fourteen dollars which appears by a bond bearing date February 19th 1855, and the said Godwin Holland being desirous and willing to secure and indemnify the said Wills, but more especially for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said C. E. Mungie the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, both grant, bargain and sell unto the said C. E. Mungie and his assigns forever his interest in a certain tract of land formerly belonging to Henry Conley Sr. & known as the William Wills' plantation purchased by him the said Holland at a late sale of Jesse Cobb upon the following terms, viz: that if the said Holland fail to pay and discharge the abovementioned debt when called for, the said C. E. Mungie shall as soon as ordered by the said J. Wills by a written order written at three of the most public places in the neighborhood taking begin the day of sale and after giving such notice he shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash the abovementioned tract in land tract of land, and out of the proceeds thereof pay to the said Wills the abovementioned debt with cost and to pay over the surplus (if any) he shall pay to said Holland as he orders.
