Thorp of the County of Greenville of the second part, and whereas the above named James Harris Comm. appointed by the said Court at December term 1854, in execution of the power conferred on him, after duly complying with the provisions of the said laws, had sold at public auction to the said Evaline D. Thorp, a certain tract of land which lot E. England did seized and possessed at five dollars and fifty cents per acre. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of thirteen hundred and seventy five dollars and cents to him around told paid in three equal bonds in compliance with the said laws by the said Evaline D. Thorp, to the said James Harris Comm. as aforesaid hath granted, bargained and sold unto the said Evaline D. Thorp all that tract or parcel of land whereof the said lot E. England did seized and possessed containing by a recent survey two hundred and fifty acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows, to wit, by the Main Arm of the Three Creeks, the line of Edridge Agood, Martha D. England and the portion of land allotted to the heirs of George Williamson dec. which was purchased by Sterling Hodge. The metes and boundaries well mutually appear by reference to a deed from David C. Williamson to lot E. England and of records in the Clerk's Office of the County of Southampton dated the day of 1854. It have and to hold the said granted premises with their appurtenances to her the said Evaline D. Thorp and to her heirs forever. And the said James Harris Comm. as aforesaid covenant with the said Evaline D. Thorp that she shall have quiet possession and good title to the said granted premises free from the claims of the said Harris Comm. as aforesaid and all other persons claiming through or under him.
