

This Deed, made this 21st day of July 1855, between Jesse Turner, son of the County of Southampton & State of Virg., of the first part, Joseph W. Coland of said County & State of second part and S. J. W. Drury and Samuel Drury of the third part, the said Jesse Turner do grant bargain and sell unto the said Joseph W. Coland the following property, to wit: five feather beds and furniture with sheets, one dozen dining chairs, 1 blk walnut table, one pine press, 3 pine chest, 1 trunk, one bed and six sheets, one bed and calf, also my interest in my son William Turner's estate for my services attending to his farm the present year. I do have to secure the following debts are bond due S. J. W. Drury for fifty one dollars and eighty six cents with interest from that day January 1855, one bond due the same due the 21st day of July 1855, one bond due Samuel Drury for one hundred and twenty dollars due 1st day of June 1855. Now the said Jesse Turner is to remain in full and quiet possession of the said property till the said Joseph W. Coland is directed by the said S. J. W. Drury and Samuel Drury to make sale of the same for the purpose of satisfying the above named debts with interest thereon and all legal cost attending this deed, any time after such directions being given the said Coland acting as trustee shall give due notice at proper places, make sale of the same and apply the proceeds of the sale of the property to said debts, also apply the said interest attending to which said Turner holds in William Turner's estate, if necessary to discharge the same and the balance of any sum due to the said Jesse Turner witness our hands outside the day and year above written.

This Deed made this 2^d day of August 1855, between L. R. Edwards and Richard Holcomb of the one part and Robert Whitehead of the other part, Witnesseth, that whereas the said Robert Whitehead on the 15th day of November 1851, did execute a deed conveying to the above named L. R. Edwards a tract of land lying and being in a Village Parish in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and fifty seven acres more or less bounded by the lands of Martha Williams & Sally Drake, Henry Whitehead, James Taylor, Jordan Thurst & the former owned himself. I do have to secure the payment of a debt due from said Whitehead to Richard Holcomb of five hundred & twenty five dollars to become due & every interest from the 20th day of January 1853, and to be paid as in said deed is set forth. And whereas the said Robert Whitehead has fully paid off & discharged the said debt due the said Holcomb. Now therefore the said L. R. Edwards with the assent & approval of the said Richard Holcomb being first by his becoming a party to and signing this deed, doth release to the said Robert Whitehead all his claims against the said land.
