

Whereas the said Thomas W. Riddle is indebted to the said Jacob Turner by his bond  
 late the 2<sup>d</sup> day of July 1855, in the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars and interest  
 indebted to the said John J. Riddle by his bond late the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1855,  
 in the sum of fifty dollars, and the said Thomas W. Riddle (John Riddle) will  
 desirous to secure the aforesaid debts and Interest. Now this instrument witnesseth  
 that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of the  
 collateral to him the said Thomas W. Riddle whom paid by the said Geo. C.  
 Pope at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt  
 whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Thomas W. Riddle hath  
 given, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth give, grant,  
 bargain and sell to the said Geo. C. Pope his heirs and assigns forever the  
 following property, to wit: his present growing crop of corn, fodder and  
 cotton & he have and to hold to him the said Geo. C. Pope forever and  
 behalf forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Geo. C. Pope shall  
 at the request of either one of the abovesaid parties after giving at least  
 ten days notice of the time and place of sale, sell at public auction  
 all the property herein named or so much thereof as shall be sufficient  
 to satisfy said debts and Interest and out of the proceeds first pay  
 the expenses therof, then pay Jacob Turner and John J. Riddle  
 debts with interest, and the balance if any pay over to the said  
 Thomas W. Riddle or his legal representative. And the said Thomas  
 W. Riddle covenant with the said Geo. C. Pope that he is possessed  
 of an absolute fee simple right to all the property herein named  
 and that he will forever warrant and defend the same against himself  
 and all other persons whatsoever. In testimony whereof we each of
