This Deed made the fifth day of June A. D. One thousand eight hundred and fifty five, between William D. Moore of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Musick of the County aforesaid in the State of Virginia, of the other part, Whereas John W. Gordon of the County and State aforesaid, did on the 17th day of May A. D. 1835, in order to secure the payment of the sum of fifteen hundred and nine dollars and sixty eight cents due the said William Musick conveyed by indenture of Deed to the said William D. Moore as trustee two certain tracts of land lying and being in the aforesaid County said to contain three hundred and eighty acres also all of his undivided interest in and to the following named slaves of the late Jesse Gordon deceased viz: Jacob, John, Sophia, Oliver, Anne, Wiley, Mary, Nancy, Mary, Adeline and Anderson and future increase of the females, report trust for uses and purposes therein mentioned and the said tracts of land and the undivided interest in and to the said slaves having been duly advertised as by said indenture directed, the said land and the undivided interest in and to the said slaves and appurtenances was exposed to public sale to the highest bidder on the 1st day of May 1855, when William Musick became the best bidder and purchaser of the same for the sum of two thousand one hundred and thirty one dollars. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said William D. Moore for and in consideration of the sum of Two thousand one hundred and thirty one dollars he has received and paid by the said William Musick at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William Musick, the two tracts of land and the undivided interest in and to the slaves aforesaid, the aforesaid land is bounded by the lands of Willis W. Lawrence, Shes. Harcum, William W. Knight and others as aforesaid and containing three hundred and eighty acres more or less with the appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the undivided interest in and to the said slaves. To have and to hold the said tracts of land and the undivided interest in and to the said slaves with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said William Musick his heirs, assigns free from the claim of the said William D. Moore his heirs and assigns shall will and do warrant and forever defend the right and title which he derived or acquired by virtue of the indenture of Trust aforesaid and no more.
