This Deed made the sixth day of October in the year 1855, between  
Lear Holland of the one part & Robert S. Jones of the other part,  
Witnesseth, that the said Lear Holland doth grant unto the said Robert  
S. Jones a certain tract of land known as the Melchior Deposit tract, con-  
taining two hundred and thirty acres more or less of bounded by the lands of John  
Whithead, Mark T. Peete and others, together with all and singular  
the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining; the said  
tract of land being the same land conveyed to the said Lear Holland by  
Morrison R. Joyner & wife by deed dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of September 1853,  
& this day admitted to record in the Clerk's office of Southampton County  
Court, and said land being and being in the said County of Southampton.  
In trust to secure the payment of three bonds bearing even date  
with this deed, due & owing by the said Lear Holland to Morrison  
R. Joyner, the first of said bonds being for the sum of one  
thousand dollars due & payable the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1856, the second of said bonds being for the sum of five hundred  
dollars due & payable on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January 1857,  
and the third and last of said bonds being for the sum of  
five hundred dollars due & payable the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1858. And the said Lear Holland for himself, his heirs,  
and assigns covenants with the said Robert S. Jones that he will  
warrant generally the property hereby conveyed. And it is agreed  
by and between the parties to this deed that the said Lear Holland  
shall have quiet and peaceful possession of the tract of land hereby  
conveyed until default be made in any or either or the whole of  
said bonds, then it shall be the duty of the said Robert S. Jones  
after having first given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale  
to sell at public auction for cash to the highest bidder the  
tract of land hereby conveyed and with the proceeds thereof first pay  
the expenses of this trust, then pay such of the said bonds as shall  
not have been paid with such interest as shall have accrued  
thereon and the balance, if any, pay over to the said Lear Holland  
or his representatives, but should there be no default in the payment  
of either of the said bonds, this deed shall be null & void
