This Indenture made and entered into this Twenty ninth day of October 1855, between
 Ernest F. Hill of the one part and John W. Hammon of the second part and Edward Beaton
 of the third part; witnesseth, that whereas Edward Beaton and Henry Cookman
 my securities to my bond to the Administrators of Henry H. Hill's estate and
 to two bonds due the estate of Henry Hinckel for the purchase of two tracts of
 Land sold by John J. Hinckel contains within the two bonds amount to
 about twelve hundred dollars and the amt due the heirs of Henry H.
 Hill's estate am't to about onethousand Dollars Also notes & accts
 due Edward Beaton to the amount of three hundred dollars one note
 due George Hunt and Edward Beaton security to the amt of eighty
 dollars and to Edward Beaton for Simon's claims due by the sale of
 Hill to the amt of twelve hundred & thirty five Dollars due the fol-
 lowing persons viz: Allen Hill's estate two hundred Dollars,
 Martha Smith two hundred dollars, Margaret Bennett eight
 Dollars, Hill & Spies eight Dollars, James V. Darton one hundred
 and fifty Dollars, Rose & Blenker fifty Dollars, Orson Clements
 One hundred dollars, Lewis Vick twenty five dollars and Lewis
 Howell three hundred dollars. And being desirous to secure the said
 Edward Beaton & Henry Cook for the payment thereof, I have
 for and in consideration of one Dollar in hand paid to the said
 John W. Hammon bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed
 by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell alien, enfeoff and
 confirm unto the said John W. Hammon his heirs, executors, Adminis-
 trators and assigns the following property, to wit: Two tracts of land
 contained four hundred and forty five Acres more or less, the
 said land sold by John J. Hinckel, Belonging to the estate of Henry
 Hinckel, situate & lying in the County of Suffolk, Eight miles
 from East Quogue, (one mile West) Peter, Jacob, Anna, Alice &
 Linda, five week houses, three work agent, seventeen head
 of Cattle, eight fat hogs, forty out hogs, and their increase, all my
 crop of Corn, Potatoes & Black-Beets, three carts, wheels and
 all my farming utensils. To have and to hold the aforesaid
 property unto him the said John W. Hammon his Executrix & Adminis-
 trator for the following trust and purpose, that is to say, the four first
 named tracts is to be paid and satisfied first. And the balance of
 the claims the said Edward Beaton is to have the management of
 and pay to the best advantage and in case there should not be
 enough to pay all they shall be paid in proportion to the amt
 of their claims named in this trust after satisfying the four first
 named (and that is to say) if the said E. T. Bell shall fail to
 pay unto the said Edward Beaton the debts aforesaid, the last
 and interest which may accrue thereon or any of said debts and interest
 when demanded, it shall and may be lawful for the said John W. Hammon
 or in case of his death or his legal representative who is hereby
 authorized
