This Deed made this 3rd day of October, in the year, one thousand eight hundred
and fifty four, between John J. Kindred, Commissioner as herein after mentioned of the
first part and William E. Myrick of the County of Southampton of the other
part. witnesseth: that whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court of the said
County of Southampton rendered at the November term thereof in the year 1852
in cause No. 34, the style of which is "Platt guardian of Kindred
vs. Kindred, deceased, & others," the said Inc. J. Kindred was appointed
as a special Commissioner to sell at public auction the real estate of
which Henry Kindred died seized and which by his will was devised to
his children, and the said Commissioner having so sold the same commonly
known as the "Maherian Place," and the said William E. Myrick having
bought the same for the sum of four thousand dollars. And whereas
the said Circuit Court did at the May term thereof A.D. 1854, confirm
the said sale and make another decree directing the said Kindred to proceed
to collect the purchase money therefor and to execute to the purchaser
proper Deeds therefor. Now this doth witnesseth; that the said
Kindred for and in consideration of the premises and further in consideration of
the said sum of four thousand dollars paid to him by the said William E.
Myrick the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and
convey to the said Myrick and his heirs forever in fee simple all that tract
or parcel of Land in the said proceeding mentioned known as the "Maherian
Place" containing six hundred and ten acres more or less lying in the said
County and bounded by the lands of Miles Cook the said W. E.
Myrick, the estate of Etheldred Smith & others. To have and to hold
the said tract of land and all the appurtenances thereto belonging
to him the said W. E. Myrick & his heirs forever.

It is the expectation of the said Commissioner that a perfect title in
fee simple is hereby made, but he makes the conveyance free from the
claims of himself and all persons claiming under the said decree as heirs
