This Deed made this the 22nd day of October, 1855, between William Mc Cobb, Commissioner, of the first part, and William Sanford of the second part, Whereas, by virtue of a decree of the court of Southampton County rendered at May term 1855, the said William Mc Cobb, was appointed a Commissioner to make sale of the land of which Lewis Almond died seized and possessor, and the said William Mc Cobb having given the notice of the time and place of sale required by said decree, did on the 19th day of June 1855, upon the said land for sale to the highest bidder in a credit of nine months and the said William Sanford became the purchaser for the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars and the whole of the purchase money having been paid, the said William Mc Cobb Commissioner aforesaid did by grant and convey unto the said William Sanford the said tract of land of which Lewis Almond died seized and possessor containing by estimation One hundred and fifty acres to him and his heirs forever.
