This Indenture made this 25th day of October 1853, between David
Doyal and Eliza his wife of the one part, John Pittell of the second part
and Joseph Pittell of the third part, witnesseth, that whereas the
said David Doyal is justly indebted to the said Joseph Pittell
in the sum of two hundred and fifty Dollars due by bond on demand
the 18th day of October 1853, and the said David Doyal binds willing
and desires to secure the payment of the aforesaid bond having agreed
to convey the property hereafter mentioned unto the said John Pittell
in trust to be sold for that purpose. Now this indenture witnesseth that
for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further considera-
tion of one dollar to the said Joe. Pittell in hand paid by the said
John Pittell trustee at and before the sealing and delivering of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given and granted the aforesaid
bond and conveyance unto the said John Pittell and by these presents doth
give grant, sell and convey unto the said John Pittell trustee his heirs
one certain tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the County of
Suffolk and containing three hundred & thirty $\frac{1}{3}$ acres more or less
and bounded by the lands of Richard Williams, Patrick St. Goultong
& Richard Kelly with all and singular the appurtenances to the
said tract of land belonging in any way appertaining unto the
said John Pittell his heirs &c. Notwithstanding the said John Pittell shall
permit the said David Doyal and Eliza his wife to remain in quiet
and peaceable possession of the aforesaid property until payment be
made in the payment of the aforesaid bond then it shall be the
duty of the said John Pittell upon being required so to do by either
one of the aforesaid parties to sell the within named property after
having given legal notice of the time and of sale to the highest
bidder for each and of the proceeds of said sale first paying and satisfying
all charges attending this trust. Then pay and discharge the bond due the said Joseph Pittell and the surplus if any, pay over to the
said David Doyal and Eliza his wife or their order or assigns.
