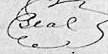


County of Southampton it was decreed and ordered by the said Court in a certain cause that depending in the chancery side of said Court between the said John St. Bishop plaintiff and John St. Bishop and others defendants that the said Samuel Kello Commissioner appointed by the Court for the purpose to convey unto the said John St. Bishop by good and sufficient deed in law the tract of land in the bill mentioned and described hereunto as the Stony Plantation. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Samuel Kello Commissioner as aforesaid and party to the first part of this Indenture in pursuance of said decree or hath given, granted, bargained and sold unto the said John St. Bishop his heirs and assigns the said tract of land known as the Stony Plantation containing about 173 acres and more particularly described in the bill above mentioned, to which reference is hereby made, to have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto and pertaining to the said John St. Bishop and his heirs forever. And the said Samuel Kello Commissioner as aforesaid the said tract of land against himself and his heirs and all other persons or persons claiming by through or under him unto the said John St. Bishop his heirs and assigns shall and will by these presents warrant and force defend. In witness whereof the said Samuel Kello Commissioner as aforesaid and party of the first part to this Indenture has set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first before written.
