This Indenture made and entered into on the 19th day of November in the year of our
Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty five, between Edward C. Crumpler, of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part and Augustus Crumpler
of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Edward
C. Crumpler for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand six hundred dollars to
him in hand paid by the said Augustus Crumpler at and before the sealing and
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted,
bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto him
the said Augustus Crumpler his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or
parcel of land situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southamp-
ton and parish of Saint Luke's containing by estimation two hundred and
ninety acres or there more or less it being part of the tract of
land whereon the said Edward C. Crumpler now resides and bounded as
follows, To wit: Beginning at a black gum standing on the bank of Nottoway
river opposite the upper end of the horse shoe bend place, thence along a
line of marked trees bearing S. 65° W. to a hickory standing on the South
side of a branch; thence along a straight line S. 82° W. to the South
side of the path at the field thence some course on the South side of
the path to a large ditch, thence up the ditch some course to the bend in said
ditch near the Gill house, thence up the various courses of the said ditch
to John B. Jenkins' line; thence along said John B. Jenkins' line of marked
trees to a dead pine at Jimmie's Gut, thence down the Gut to said
Nottoway river; thence up the river to the beginning. To have and to hold the
