Briggs against the claims of all and every person claiming by, through or under him unto the said W. L. Briggs & assigns. Upon trust nevertheless that the said W. L. Briggs his heirs, Executors and Administrators shall permit the said Ino. H. Brooks to remain and quiet and peaceable possession of the said mules hereby conveyed and the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment in the bond executed to Geo. W. Peete, either in part or the whole; also the bond executed to the said Gentry, and then upon this further trust that he the said W. L. Briggs shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment as he may think proper or the said Ino. H. Gentry his Executors, Admins or assigns shall request sell the said six mules at public auction for ready money after having fixed the time and place of sale at his discretion and given due notice thereof: and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfy the cost charges thereof and all other expenses attend these presents, first pay and satisfy the debt to which the said Ino.
