This Deed made the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of August in the year 1855, between John Taylor a descendant of the Hatteras Tribe of Indians of the first part and Edwin Tanner another descendant of the said tribe of the second part, Witnesseth; that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty seven Dollars and fifty cents to the said John Taylor by the said Edwin Tanner paid, the said John Taylor doth grant unto the said Edwin Tanner all that tract of land lying in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, allotted by an order of the County Court of the said County at the August term 1855, to the said John Taylor as his interest in the real estate held in common of the said Hatteras Tribe of Indians in the said County, the said tract of land containing fifty nine acres and bounded as follows to-wit: Beginning at the center of two chestnut beams and well oak stand in on Hatteras River a corner for Edwin Tanner, thence along said Tanner's line N 16<sup>o</sup> 40' 17<sup>o</sup> poles to a stake a corner for Daniel Boyernant thence along the line S 56<sup>o</sup> 2' 60' poles to a post a corner for the said Daniel Boyernant in the Muddy Woodson's line; thence along said Muddy Woodson's line N 16<sup>o</sup> 40' 17<sup>o</sup> poles to a post a corner at the edge of the low grounds; thence along a new line of marked trees across the low grounds N 44<sup>o</sup> 2' 60' 152 poles to a bush standing at the river near the mouth of the string fork (just) a new corner for said John Taylor, thence up the margin of the river to the beginning.
