Munroe Trustee as soon as requested by the aforesaid securities after giving at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, to sell at public auction to the highest bidder for each the aforesaid tract and parcel of land with all the privileges, improvements and advantages also the negro woman Hannah, and make good and sufficient title to the purchaser or purchasers direct pay all cost pertaining to these presents, the debts aforesaid or so much as may be unpaid. And the remainder pay over to the said Jacob Lenox and Narceffe his wife or order. Bailey of the second part whereas on the 7th day of November in the year 1851, it was ordered and decreed by the Circuit Court of Southampton County in a certain cause then depending in the Chancery side of said Court between J. M. Bailey and W. S. Gooden, plaintiff and Samuel Nicholas and others defendants, that the said William S. Gooden Commissioner appointed by the Court for the purpose, convey unto the said John M. Bailey by good and sufficient deed in law the house and lot in Jerusalem known as Lot No. 15 in the plat of said town. Now this Indenture witnesses that the said William S.
