

This Deed made this 10th day of March A.D. 1856, between Ordens L. Bailey
 & Elizabeth E. Bailey his wife of the first part John H. Lefroy of the second part, and
 William H. Spratley of the third part, witnesseth; that the said Bailey is justly indebted
 to the said Spratley in the sum and full sum of £201.07 due May 30 A.D. 1856 by note, also
 in the sum of £91.00 due by note on 25th day of December 1856, also in the sum
 of £723.00 due by bond bearing date 10th day of March 1856. And the said Bailey
 set forth being desirous to secure the payment of the said sums above named as well as the further purpose
 of securing the property hereinafter mentioned to his wife and children. Now on consideration of
 the premises as well as the further consideration of five dollars to them in hand by the said
 Bailey & wife have given, granted & sold and by these presents do grant unto the said
 John H. Lefroy the following property trust: 2 houses, 1 yoke of oxen, 2 cows & calves,
 2 carts & gear, 3 ploughs & gear, 120 head of hogs, 1 buggy & harness, 2 boxes of
 furniture, 6 setting chairs, and all other house and kitchen furniture, also all their
 right, title and interest in the Estate of Nancy Miller dec'd. late of the County of
 Southampton to him and his heirs forever. In trust nevertheless, that the said John H.
 Lefroy shall permit the said Bailey & wife to retain the possession of the property
 above specified until required by the said Spratley or his representatives to take
 possession of all, and when thence required sell the same and pay the above debts
 and upon the further trust that the said Lefroy shall receive the estate which
 may come to the said Bailey & wife from the estate of the said Miller, and out of
 the same pay to the said Spratley the debts herein specified, and interested to be assessed
 with all the accruing interest and upon the further trust that he shall hold the
 balance he may receive from Miller's estate for the joint use and benefit of the said
 Ordens L. Bailey & Elizabeth his wife during their joint and separate lives and
 at their death to be conveyed to their children. And the said trustee shall
 have power to purchase land & hold the same on the same terms uses and limitations
 above specified with power to sell any of the personal property or use any money he
 may receive for the purpose of executing the purposes of this deed. And the said
 Bailey & wife for themselves their heirs & descendants to warrant and defend the title to the prop-
 erty and interest hereby conveyed against the claims and demands of all persons whatsoever.
