 further consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said Almey Joyner a sufficient
 money and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given
 and granted (and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Almey Joyner her
 executors, administrators and assigns, one feather bed and furniture, a set of crockery
 one gun and my chest of tools, at her death to my grandson John Joyner, to have
 and to hold the said feather bed and furniture &c. unto her the said Almey Joyner
 her executors, administrators and assigns forever. And the said Irjah Johnson
 for himself his executors and administrators the said feather bed and furniture &c.
 unto the said Almey Joyner her executors, administrators and assigns against the claim
 of him the said Irjah Johnson his executors, and administrators and against the claim or
 claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever
