This Deed made the 15 day of April 1856. Between Jesse Johnson of the first part E. S. Will of the second part, and John R. Rockelle of the third part all of the said parties of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said Jesse Johnson in debt to the said John R. Rockelle by bonds bearing date the 1. day of January 1854 in the sum of forty eight dollars, also one bond bearing date Feb. 8. 1856 in the sum of twenty two dollars, and the said Jesse Johnson being willing to secure the aforesaid debt.

Now this Indenture witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid he the said Jesse Johnson do grant, bargain and sell unto E. S. Will the following named property, to wit: all of my right, title and interest in the certain Charles Story's dec'd. farm, upon trust now witnesseth that the E. S. Will shall at the request of the said J. R. Rockelle or his legal representative after giving at least ten days notice of the intended sale sell at publick auction for cash the aforesaid interest or such part as may be sufficient to pay and discharge the said debts interest and cost if so much there be and out of the proceeds first pay the expenses thereof, then pay the aforesaid debts and interest, and the surplus if any pay over to the said Jesse Johnson or his legal representative. This Indenture made this day of in the year of our Lord 1856 Between Wm^m Atkinson of the first part Arrington Britt of the second part and Ivin W. Duck of the third part. Whereas the said Arrington Britt on the 23rd day of July in the year 1852 in order to secure the payment of the sum of one hundred and ninety two dollars and fifty cents to the said Ivin W. Duck did by indenture of trust of the property (to wit) forty three acres of land more or less together with all the chattel real mentioned in said deed of trust, in trust for the use & purposes therein mentioned. And whereas since the executing and delivery of the said deed of trust, the said Arrington Britt hath fully satisfied and paid to the said Ivin W. Duck the amount hereby specified & secured which the said Ivin W. Duck doth hereby acknowledge.
