This Indenture made and entered into this first day of April 1856 between Adrian
 Cornell of Mary Ann his wife, & C. H. Beans of Cynthia his wife of the State of Pennsylvania
 of the first part Richard H. Baker Jr of the City of Norfolk State of
 Virginia of the second part and James H. Mungo of the County of Southampton
 and State last aforesaid of the third part: Whereas the said Adrian
 Cornell and William R. Beans are justly indebted to the said James H. Mungo
 in the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred dollars (\$2500) lawful money of
 Virginia, with legal interest thereon from the this day of January 1856,
 until paid as is evidenced by their bond of that date payable at or
 before the first day of April 1857 it being for the balance of the
 purchase money of a tract of land in the County of Southampton aforesaid, which
 the said Mungo has sold and conveys to the said Cornell and Beans by
 deed of Bargain and Sale to be executed, and delivered by him to them Simulta-
 neously with the execution and delivery of these presents, the payment of
 which said sum of money and interest the said Cornell and Beans are desirous
 to secure. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth, that the said Adrian
 Cornell of Mary Ann his wife and C. H. Beans of Cynthia his wife
 for and in consideration of the premises, and the further consideration of five dollars
 to them in hand paid by the said Richard H. Baker Jr. the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold and do hereby
 grant, bargain and sell unto the said Rich H. Baker Jr. his heirs and
 assigns forever, with general warranty the following property to wit; That
 certain tract of land in the County of Southampton called "Mall Hill"
 containing Six hundred and forty two acres more or less together with
 the buildings and improvements thereon, being of the same tract or parcel
 of Land which was this day sold and conveyed to said Cornell and
 Beans by the said Mungo by Deed of bargain and sale of even date
 herewith and to which reference is here made for a full and detailed
 description of the property hereby conveyed: To have and to hold
 the same unto him the said Rich H. Baker Jr. his heirs and assigns
 forever. Upon trust however to secure to the said Mungo the pay-
 ments of the said sum of Two thousand Five Hundred dollars and interest
 abovementioned. And upon default being made by the said Cornell
 and Beans in the payment of the said Bond at or before the said last
 day
