This Indenture made this 13th day of June A.D. 1855, between James A. Gilllette, Isaac M. Arnold, Jesse Little, Daniel M. Cobb, M^r H. Nicholson and M^r J. Sebrill, Trustees in trust of the one part and Jas. E. Sebrill, all of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Jas. A. Gilllette, Isaac M. Arnold, Jesse Little, Daniel M. Cobb, M^r H. Nicholson and M^r J. Sebrill trustees aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of two Hundred and six Dollars in hand paid at the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained sold and conveyed (and by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto him the said Jas. E. Sebrill all of the right, title and interest of which they hold int, to and upon a certain lot of land in the County of Southampton about half a mile below the Barn Tavern on the north or east of Main road leading to Jerusalem and bounded as follows, beginning in the middle of the main road at a large red oak, thence a line of marked trees at right angles to the road, seventy yards, thence a line of marked trees parallel to the road seventy yards, thence a line of marked trees seventy yards to the middle of the road and thence up the road to the beginning, containing one acre of Land: To have and to hold the above described lot of Land with the building thereon erected known as the Barn Tavern Academy and all of the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Jas. E. Sebrill his heirs or assigns free from the claims of us or either of us as the above mentioned trustees, In testimony whereof, we have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and day above written
