

This Deed made the 31 day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty six, between Elijah Joyner and James H. Bennett, Witnesses; that in consideration of the said Elijah Joyner doth grant unto the said J. H. Bennett all his interest in a Lot of Land one acre in the south corner of the land the said Joyner purchased of Davis Bryant decd. Commencing from the road running westward direction ten or fifteen steps to a ditch then down the ditch in a north direction fifty or seventy five steps then in a north direction to the road, then along the road to the beginning for which the said James H. Bennett hath paid to the said Elijah Joyner ten dollars for which amt. I warrant and defend the write of the said Land provided or he have the offer of it at a reasonable price.
