 consideration of six hundred dollars the said William White and Martha his
 wife doth grant unto the said Edwin F. White a certain tract or parcel of
 land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing One hundred and
 seven and one half acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Nicholas
 J. Barkum, David A. St. Bellings, John Hines and the County road leading
 from Barkum's Mill to Green Lane: to have and to hold the said described tract
 and parcel of land to the said Edwin F. White and his heirs forever.
