wife doth grant unto the said Edwin F. White a certain tract or parcel of
land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing One hundred and
seventy acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Nicholas
J. Braham, David H. St. Bellings, John Niles and the County road leading
from Braham's Mill to Jerusalem: to have and to hold the said described tract
and parcel of land to the said Edwin F. White and his heirs forever.
