Now this Indenture with covenants that for and in consideration premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said Wiley Jagers Jr. in hand paid by the said Patrick Anne at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Wiley Jagers Jr. hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm to the said Patrick Anne his heirs and assigns forever the following property, to wit: five fat hogs, and one sow six pigs, and four hogs and their increase, together with all my household property of all sorts except two feather beds and furniture.
