This Deed made this 27th day of December in the year 1856, between William Prince
 Commissioner and Samuel Kello Adm. with the will annexed of William Prince dec^d
 of the one part and Samuel Drury of the other part, all of the County of Southampton
 Whereas the County Court of Southampton County at the November and December Term
 of said Court in the year 1856, by decree appointed the said William Prince and Thomas
 Samuel Kello Commissioners to sell a certain tract of land hereinafter more particularly
 described belonging to the estate of the said William Prince dec^d. And whereas also the
 said William Prince dec^d in his last will and testament (admitted to record in the
 Clerk's Office of the County aforesaid in the year 1855, devised the aforesaid tract
 of land to be sold after the death of his wife Martha Prince and the said Martha
 Prince having died in the month of September in the year aforesaid. Now this Deed
 Witnesseth, that in consideration of the facts before stated and in further considera-
 tion of the sum of three thousand one hundred and ten dollars paid by the said Samuel
 Drury to the said Commissioners and the said adm. with the will annexed of William
 Prince dec^d above stated, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said par-
 ties, they the said William Prince and the said Sam. Kello Commissioners of Court
 and the said Sam. Kello adm. with the will annexed of the said William Prince dec^d. in
 pursuance of said will have given and granted and do by their presents give,
 grant, bargain and sell unto the said Sam. Drury the aforesaid tract of land
 bounded and described as follows, to-wit: On the South and east by three acres
 on the north by the lands of Sam. Drury and William Prince and on the west
 by the land of the said William Prince, containing seven hundred and thirty
